Dear Justin and Town Board Members:

As per your request, we have prepared the Boundary Map and Description modifications for the extension of the Town of Hector Water District. This extension to the district is provided as Part X as outlined on the Hector Water District Extension 1B Map.

A Map, Plan and Report for the Schwartz Lake Front residence (Tax Account #33.00-5-24) to be included in the Town of Hector Water District No. 1; Extension 1B; Part X has been prepared by Stephen J. A. Maybee, P.E. dated December 21, 2021. We have attached to this letter, a copy of the Part X Boundary Map and Boundary Description of the area to be included in the district, along with one (1) set of Water District Maps (3 sheets) for your use and to keep on file.

We believe that **installation of a private water service** would be considered a **Type II Action in** accordance with Article 8 (State Environmental Quality Review Act) of the New York State Environmental Conservation Law and 6 NYCRR Part 617.5.c. paragraphs 11 and 13 and would not be subject to review under SEQR.

We believe the Town Board Action associated with the **Water District Extension** is subject to SEQR and should be considered an "**Unlisted Action**". To that end we prepared the attached Short EAF for the **Water District Formation Action ONLY**. We suggest that you review the Short EAF, and if you concur with our preparation of the document, that you pass a resolution accepting the Short Environmental Assessment form prepared by MRB Group for the Water District Formation Action ONLY and adopt a "Negative Resolution" associated with the Water District Extension, sign the Short EAF, and close SEQR.

The Town Board should review the legal steps necessary with your Town Attorney.


